

Key Information

- 1 A journey could be for a holiday or a day trip.
- 2 You can go on a journey by car, boat, bus, coach, aeroplane, ferry, train, bicycle or on foot.
- 3 People going on journeys often use maps to plan their route. There are many different types of map.
- 4 A Sat-Nav is a bit like a map, but it is able to use satellites in space to locate where you are and where you need to go.
- 5 A long time ago, horse drawn buses were used to get people from place to place.
- 6 A double decker bus, is a bus that has two levels so that passengers can sit upstairs or downstairs.
- 7 A single decker bus is a bus that has only one level and carries passenger.
- 8 An articulated bus has a bend in the middle to enable to turn corners more easily. They also can fit more passengers on their bus.

| Journey | An act of travelling from one place to another. |
| Map | A diagram of an area of land or sea. |
| City | A place where people live and work that is larger than a town. |
| Village | A village is a community made up of a small number of houses, usually in a country area. |
| Town | An area which larger than a village but smaller than a city. |
| Road | A hard flat surface for vehicles, people and animals to travel on. |
| Pavement | A hard surface that people can walk on safely, off the road. |
| Bus | A long motor vehicle with many rows of seats, used to carry large numbers of people. Buses usually travel along a regular route. |
| Wheel | A wheel is a round circle which helps a vehicle to move. |
| Axel | An axel is a rod that goes right through the very centre of a wheel to help it move and stay in place. |
| Driver | A person who drives a vehicle. |
| Passenger | Someone riding on or in a vehicle. |
